






HAYWARD'S SAFARI SANCTUARY | PRETORIA

Day 3

Following breakfast and checkout, you will be transferred to O.R. Tambo International Airport for a domestic flight to King Shaka International Airport. Upon landing, your dedicated driver will take you on a journey to Pongola Game Reserve that lasts just under 4 hours, arriving in the late afternoon. This provides you with an opportunity to unpack and get comfortably settled in your surroundings. The Orientation and Programme Discussion session will ignite excitement and anticipation for the adventures that lie ahead.



Day 5

Start your day with breakfast after which Group A will go on an educational Bush Walk, diving deeper into ecological concepts. Group B will focus on a Game Count, exploring population census methods for wildlife management. After the morning activities, both groups will enjoy a Lake Boat Cruise. This provides an opportunity to observe elephants and learn about their conservation. Lunch will be at the lodge, and in the afternoon, the groups will switch activities.



Day 4

Start your day with a quick breakfast before group activities kick off. Group A will begin with a bush walk, Camera Traps and Leopard Monitoring, while Group B will engage in a Conservation Service Project and Telemetry Monitoring. The bushwalk is an educational experience that helps students understand the ecology of the area, crucial for wildlife and flora management. During the camera trap activity, students will collect data, and later analyze it back at camp. In the telemetry monitoring session, small groups will learn about remote radio monitoring techniques and track a study animal in the reserve, contributing to conservation efforts. In the afternoon, the groups will switch activities. As the day comes to a close, enjoy a night drive, and unwind by the campfire.



Day 6

Today Group A focuses on Wildlife Survival
Strategies and Conservation Service Project,
where students learn about animal survival
tactics and contribute to conservation. Group B
engages in Camera Traps & Leopard Monitoring.
A Bush Skills Activity covers various skills. After a
lunch break, both groups hike to a sleepout site.
They set up camp, gather firewood, and maintain
a campfire throughout the night. Students take
turns on night watch, prepare meals over an
open fire, have dinner, and enjoy night activities.
This program aims to enhance students' wildlife
and conservation knowledge through hands-on
experiences.



Day 7

On this day, the groups will start with an early wake-up call to pack up and hike back to base camp, where a warm cooked breakfast awaits. Around midday, the groups will depart for the Village Introduction and Community Service Project. After enjoying a traditional lunch, they will engage in the Community Service Project, which is designed to involve meaningful, sustainable, and mutually beneficial hard work while allowing students to get to know the local community. The objectives of this experience are to foster leadership, critical thinking, cultural competence, effective communication skills, community engagement, and a passion for service among the students. After a full day of community service work, the groups will have the opportunity to reflect on their accomplishments while enjoying a specially prepared traditional dinner.



Day 9

On the final morning of the program, students will have a chance to savor their last moments of sleeping in before enjoying a cooked breakfast. Afterward, it will be time to pack up and depart for the airport. As you leave the African continent, it is our hope that you carry with you a renewed zest for life, a treasure trove of lifelong friendships, and a wealth of unforgettable experiences. Day 8

On this day, you will have the luxury of sleeping in and starting your day with a delightful traditional breakfast. Following breakfast, a traditional lunch will be served, and the Community Service Projects will take place throughout the morning and afternoon. After a full day of dedicated community service work, you and your group will have the chance to reflect on the meaningful work you have accomplished and the relationships you have forged. This reflection time will be complemented by a specially prepared traditional dinner in the evening. This day offers an opportunity for deeper engagement with the local community and a chance to appreciate the value of your contributions to their well-being.











FACTS ON SOME OF THE ANIMALS YOU MAY SEE:



THE LION:

They are the only big cats that live in social groups, known as prides. These prides typically consist of related females and their offspring, along with a few resident males.

THE HYENA:

Hyenas are highly social animals and live in groups known as clans. Within a clan, there is a complex social hierarchy with a dominant female known as the matriarch.





THE ANTELOPE:

Antelopes can be found in a range of ecosystems, including grasslands, savannas, forests, and deserts. Antelopes are herbivores, primarily feeding on grasses, leaves, and sometimes fruits.

THE RHINOCETROS:

These magnificent creatures
have been around for about
50 million years. Despite their
long evolutionary history,
rhinos are currently facing
severe extinction threats,
primarily due to habitat loss
and illegal poaching for their
horns.





THE MONITORZ LIZZATED:

They are excellent swimmers and can stay submerged underwater for a significant amount of time. Some species of monitor lizards have been observed holding their breath for up to 30 minutes while hunting.

THE ELEPHANT:

They have exceptional memory and intelligence. Elephants have one of the largest brains of any land animal, and they are known for their complex social behaviors and problem-solving abilities.





THE CIZOCODILE:

Crocodiles, ancient creatures with a history spanning over 200 million years, coexisted with dinosaurs during the prehistoric era. Their enduring presence on Earth showcases the remarkable resilience of these reptiles.

THE CHEETAH

Unlike some other big cats, cheetahs are typically solitary hunters, with males often being more social than females. They hunt during the day, primarily focusing on small to medium-sized ungulates like gazelles and impalas.


