

PRETORIA




Day 1


Day 3

FACTS ON SOME OF THE ANIMALS YOU MAY SEE:



Lion:

Lions are territorial animals and claim their territories with scent markings and vocalizations. These territories can range from a few square miles to several dozen square miles, depending on prey availability.



They are known for their stunning coat pattern, featuring rosettes that provide them with excellent camouflage in a variety of habitats. They are renowned for their elegance and adaptability.



Aardvark:

These insectivores have an incredible sense of smell, which helps them locate termite mounds hidden underground. Aardvarks possess strong claws and powerful legs that allow them to dig into termite mounds with remarkable efficiency.



They are highly social and intelligent primates that are known for their complex social structures and adaptability. They exhibit a wide range of behaviors, from grooming and playing to complex vocalizations and facial expressions.



Zebra:

Zebras are social animals and typically live in family groups known as "harems."
These harems consist of a dominant male (stallion), several females, and their young offspring. Their stripes are unique for each individual.

Elephant:

Known for their exceptional memory elephants can remember and recognize other animals and humans even after several years.
Their incredible memory helps them navigate their vast habitats and locate water sources.



Caracal:

These medium-sized wild cats are known for their agility and can leap to astonishing heights to catch birds in mid-air, often reaching more than 3 meters (10 feet) above the ground.

Pangolin:


Their scales act as a natural form of armor and provide them with an incredible defence mechanism against predators. When threatened, pangolins curl into a tight, ball-like shape,


