Kilimanjaro:

Kilimanjaro is a towering volcanic mountain located in Tanzania, East Africa. It is one of the most famous and iconic mountains in the world and is known for its stunning beauty and challenging climbing opportunities. One of the unique aspects is its distinct climate zones. These zones include tropical rainforest, moorland, alpine desert, and arctic tundra.

Moshi:

Located at the base of Mount Kilimanjaro, the town is surrounded by lush landscapes, including coffee and banana plantations. Surrounding areas have cultural sites that visitors can explore, including local markets and craft shops.



Tarangire National Park:

During the dry season, the Tarangire River attracts numerous animals, making it an excellent location for wildlife viewing. The park is famous for having one of the largest concentrations of elephants in Tanzania.

Lake Manyara:

Valley. It is a shallow,
alkaline lake with
fluctuating water levels. It
is a habitat for a wide
variety of bird species,
including flamingos,
pelicans, storks, and
various waterfowl.

Day to Day

Day 1

Upon arrival at Kilimanjaro Airport, a seamless transfer awaits to take you to the distinguished Keys Hotel. Nestled just south of the equator, Mount Kilimanjaro reigns as the loftiest peak on the African continent, and proudly claims the title of the world's tallest "free-standing" mountain. Embarking on this journey is a challenge not suited for the faint-hearted, as it promises to push the boundaries of your endurance, both mentally and physically.



Day 2

Following a nourishing breakfast at the break of dawn, a seasoned guide will conduct a comprehensive briefing for your upcoming climb. Subsequently, you will set forth towards the National Park Gate. Once the necessary formalities are attended to, your journey will commence, leading you through the breathtaking tropical rainforest. Accompanied by the capable assistant guides, you will navigate this lush environment.

As the day draws to a close, you will emerge from the verdant forest cover and reach your destination, the welcoming haven of Machame Hut.



Day to Day

Day 3

Leaving Machame Hut, you will enter the heather zone, ascending a ridge on the mountain. The initial climb is steep, followed by a gentler two-hour walk through lower moorland to a rocky bluff where lunch is usually enjoyed. Afterward, the journey continues westward towards Shira Cathedral. The final stretches of this route are relatively flat and lead you to Shira, where you will set up your resting place for the day.





Day 5

Pressing onward from Barranco, your path winds across and ascends toward Karangu Valley. The day ahead is an arduous and demanding one, encompassing a challenging journey. To ensure safety, guides may employ ropes in specific sections. Anticipate a steep

descent into Karanga Valley, followed by a brisk, short ascent out of the valley to the campsite. Brace yourself for cold weather, particularly during breaks and rest stops.



Day 7

Around 11:00 PM to midnight, a gentle wake-up call comes. Fully attire yourself with all your clothing layers, gearing up for the pivotal final ascent. Your guides will make regular stops to both rest and ensure the well-

being of the group.
The path onwards
circumnavigates the
crater rim towards the
illustrious Uhuru Peak
(5,895m), the zenith of
Africa's elevation.



Day 4



Embarking from Shira, your journey will lead you towards Barranco, with a path that gracefully skirts just beneath the imposing Lava Tower.

Along the way, anticipate a mix of steep ascents

and traverses through valleys. This descent requires a measured approach to acclimatize comfortably, as altitude gains gradually. Be mindful of the potential chill in the night temperatures at the camp. Despite this, the awe-inspiring views of Kibo's glaciers greet you and a sight of the captivating Umbwe Valley unfurls below, providing a stunning panorama that complements the experience.

Day 6

Moving forward from Karangu Valley, your journey ascends as you embark on the ultimate climb towards the summit, scheduled for tonight. Weather permitting, you will

be treated to splendid views of
Kibo along your path. Anticipate reaching your
destination around lunchtime, affording you
ample hours of reprieve before the midnight
ascent commences.

Day 8

The descent spans 3 to 4 hours, guiding you through the enchanting rainforest to Mweka Park Gate, where your awaiting vehicle will be stationed. From there, a transfer to a hotel awaits, setting the stage

for an evening of well-deserved jubilation. The guides typically present your certificates during this time. Your night's accommodation is set at Keys Hotel, offering a comfortable stay supplemented with a hearty full English breakfast.

Dedicated to providing you with the utmost in game viewing, each day unfolds as a canvas of immersive experiences within the parks. Expect a blend of morning and afternoon game drives or

or comprehensive full-day excursions to unveil the wilderness's secrets. Should you choose a "drive-in" safari, the journeys between parks might be punctuated by enriching cultural interactions with local villages or captivating historical sites, seamlessly woven with additional game viewing opportunities.

Day 11


Day 12 + 13

Ranking as Tanzania's sixth-largest national park,
Tarangire Park boasts a distinct ecosystem
defined by the remarkable long-distance
migration of wildebeest and zebras. In the arid
dry season, the river becomes a vital lifeline,
providing essential freshwater for the wildlife. This
park is renowned for its remarkable elephant

population and the iconic presence of baobab trees.
Alongside these, residents like waterbuck, giraffe, impala, gazelle, banded mongooses and olive baboons are common sights.

Day 10


Lake Manyara National Park is renowned for its tree-climbing lions, often found resting on Acacia branches. Nestled at the base of the Great Rift Valley escarpment, the park's beauty unfolds. Upon entry, a lush forest teems with baboon troops, blue and vervet monkeys. Further exploration unveils woodlands, grasslands, swamps, and the pristine soda lake. The park boasts buffalo and elephant herds, along with giraffes, hippos, reedbucks, warthogs, wildebeests, and zebras.

After a fulfilling breakfast and an invigorating game drive, your journey leads you back to Moshi, where the final night of this remarkable adventure awaits. The subsequent day marks your departure, as you are chauffeured to the Arusha Airport for your international flight. Leaving Tanzania with unforgettable memories.


