



The city is conveniently located alongside the Nairobi River, making it an excellent starting point for your Kenyan adventure. Nairobi is a lively and vibrant city, brimming with tourist attractions and offering

ample opportunities to immerse yourself in diverse cultures and visit fascinating museums.

Nestled between the majestic Mount Kenya and the expansive northern deserts, Laikipia marks the starting point of Kenya's wild and semi-arid northern frontier. This captivating region comprises privately

owned and community ranches that revolve around the heart of it all—the Laikipia National Reserve. The Reserve is one of Kenya's finest safari locations.



Ol Pejeta Conservancy, in central Kenya's Laikipia County, is East Africa's largest black rhino sanctuary and home to the last northern white rhinos. This former cattle ranch turned wildlife conservancy



offers safaris with the 'Big Five' and various other African animals. Visitors can enjoy horse rides, guided walks, and nocturnal game drives.

Lake Nakuru

Lake Nakuru National Park in Kenya's Great Rift Valley is a protected haven for diverse wildlife and vibrant bird species. Its saline waters attract large flocks of Lesser Flamingo. The park is also home to over 50 mammal



species. Visitors can enjoy scenic hikes, picnics by the lake, thrilling game drives, and a visit to the stunning Makalia Waterfall.

Day 1: Nairobi




You will visit Ngare Ndere Forest nearby, offering a captivating contrast to your last few days. A ranger will guide you to a stunning natural pool formed by a waterfall. Next, we'll explore the elevated canopy walkway, an 80-

foot-high suspension bridge extending through the forest. Enjoy a relaxing view from the wooden deck. Afterward, return to El Karama Lodge for an overnight stay.



Day 7: Ol Peteja

In the morning, you will depart for Ol Peteja.
Upon arrival, you'll check into the Stables and visit the
Chimpanzee sanctuary, where you will assist with fence inspection.



Day 2: Nairobi

You will be spending the day at One Horizon
Community Centre. This is a humanitarian aid
organization that's dedicated to caring for
abandoned and abused women and children.
At the centre, they undertake various projects
aimed at overcoming poverty, such as
nutrition and health programs.
Women are granted the opportunity to
participate in a small business program,
empowering them to start their own
businesses. During your stay
you'll witness the positive

impact of their efforts in improving the lives of those in need. It will be a meaningful experience, allowing you to connect with the local community and contribute to a cause that makes a difference.

Day 4: Laikipia

Get ready to experience a full day of wildlife in their natural habitat. You'll have the opportunity to tick off bird sightings on the checklist provided, as these beautiful animals are hard to miss in the Kenyan

wildlife. The day's activities will include a game/bird walk, which involves wildlife tracking exercises, and a game drive. There will also be a camera trap session to review captured images, along with game drives to investigate

wildlife activity near the camp. Feel free to ask as many questions as you'd like while learning about the environmental impact of tourism.

Day 6: Laikipia

Today is all about hiking! Approximately 30 km north, concealed in Samburu folklore, lies the Ol Lokowe mesa. This mountain is famous for its raptors

with Kenya's largest population of Ruppell's vultures.

Today, your focus is on endangered species, specifically the northern white rhinos at Ol Pejeta. Since 2009, OI Pejeta has provided a sanctuary for some of the last remaining individuals of this species. This presents a truly extraordinary

opportunity to observe these majestic animals up close, gaining invaluable insights into their lives and the ongoing conservation efforts dedicated to their protection.



Day 10: Lake Nakuru

You will depart for Kembu Cottages, situated on the outskirts of Nakuru. Where you will have the chance to prepare your own meals, relax amidst picturesque trees and grassy highlands, and explore the Great Rift Valley.




Day 12+13: Lake Nakuru

You'll venture into the untouched forest, where you'll sleep in hanging tree beds and learn about forest protection, survival skills, honey hunting, and the fascinating Okiek tribe. The next day, you'll return to Kembu for a relaxing night in the green grasslands. You'll get a glimpse into rural lifestyle and learn about the

inspiring Kenana Knitters community project. Enjoy a traditional Nyama Choma and Ugali dinner. These two days offer extraordinary adventures and cultural insights.

On this day, you will embark on a scenic drive to

Mt Kiplombey. Prepare for an invigorating hike over this mountain, located on the western side of the Rift Valley. Once covered in lush forests and streams, Mt Kiplombey serves as a powerful reminder of the consequences of population

growth and the importance of conservation efforts. For the night, you will have the unique experience of sleeping in the serene pine forest, which serves as a buffer zone for the magnificent Mau Forest. Its beauty will captivate you, setting the stage for a truly memorable evening.


Day 14: End of journey
